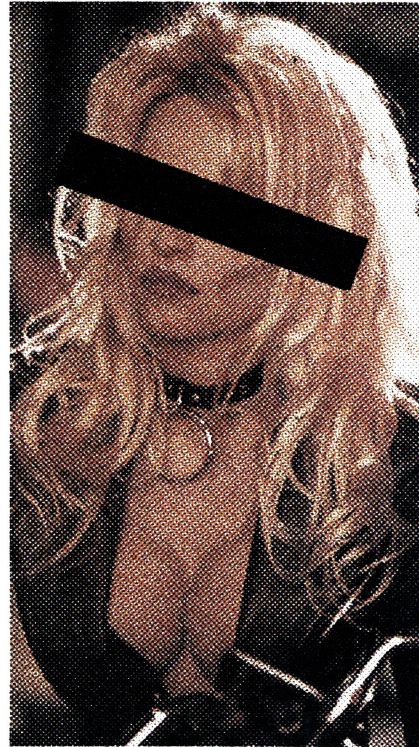

Though the opponents were poor, the 6th played some excellent astro hockey and never let up thru' out the game, with major contributions

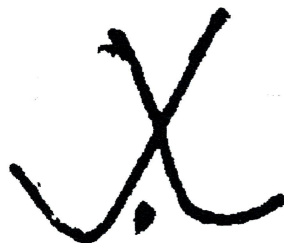

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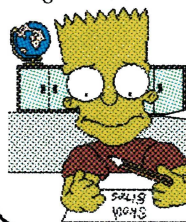

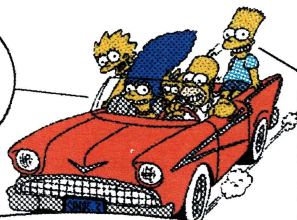
It's the end of term and young Fraser McCabe is finishing of his last colouring in assignment at Madchester University.

Soon after, the McCabe clan have picked up their eldest and are on their way home.

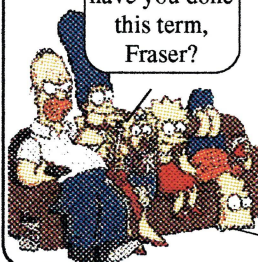
So what do you think of the new car, son?



Gee, Dad. It's cool - we can get the whole family in this one, not like that old BeeGee you used to have.

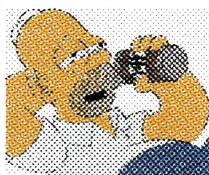
At home, they settle down to watch a bit of TV and listen to Fraser tell them about his University high-jinks...

I'll pick my team now but would you please let me know what it's really going to be by Thursday this week!

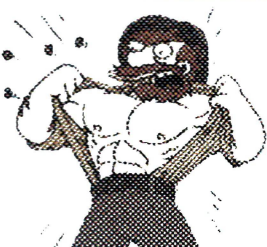


Ey, ey, calm down, I've scored 7 in a game you know, Ferry Cross The Mersey, etc. etc. etc.

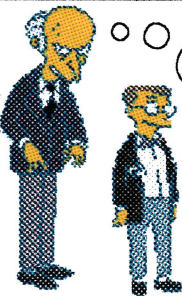

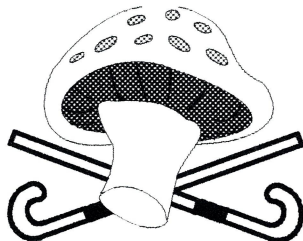
